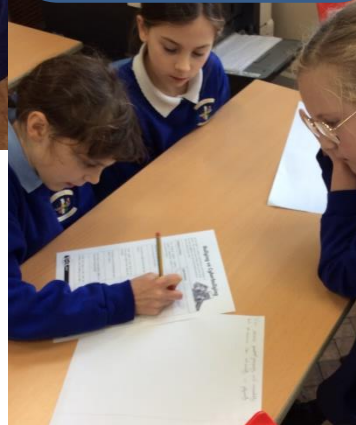

Cyber bullying is when someone does something offensive online again and again to you on purpose.

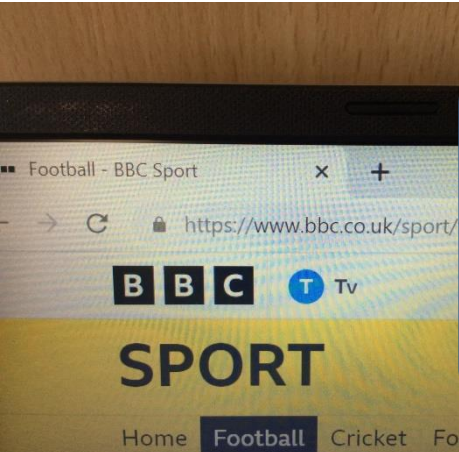


Finally we thought about possible solutions for scenarios involving cyber bullying.

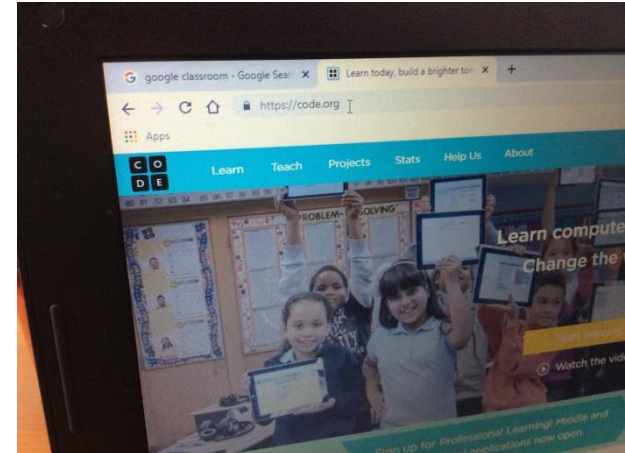
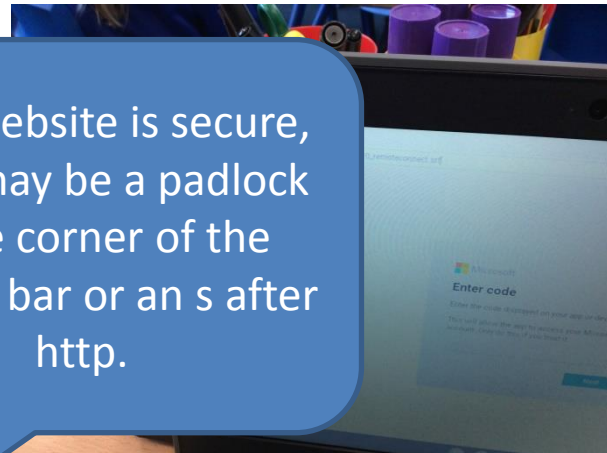


We use websites for shopping (with our parents), entertainment and for research/education.

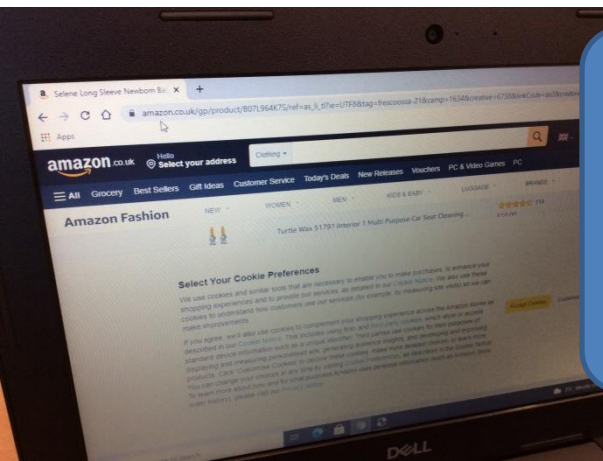
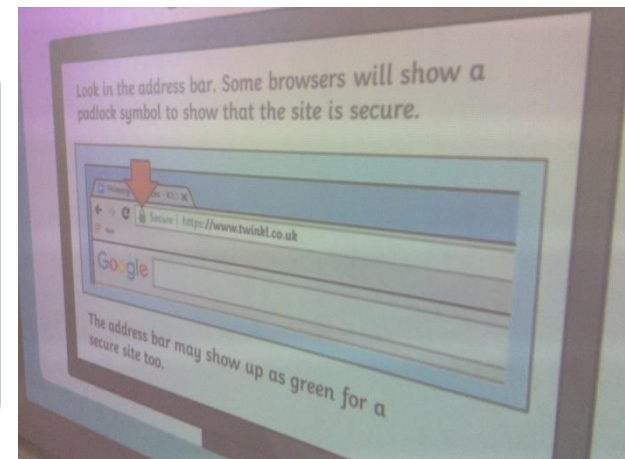
First of all we thought about the websites we use online by ourselves, with our parents and at school and then discussed what we use them for.



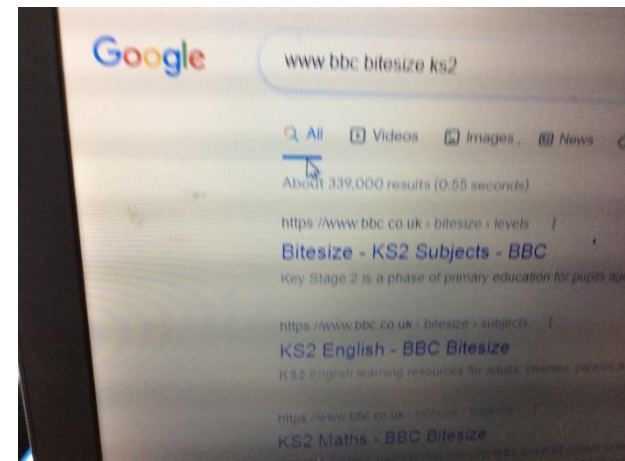
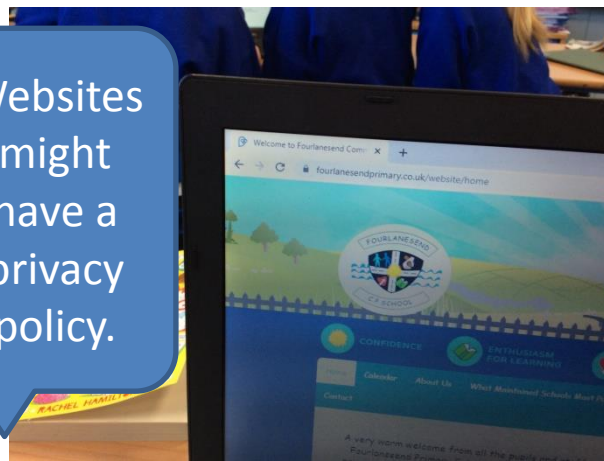
If the website is secure, there may be a padlock in the corner of the address bar or an s after http.

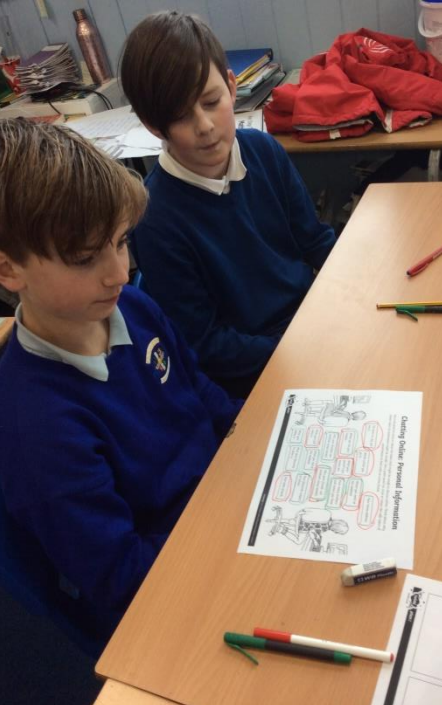


Then we discussed what information we have to give them and whether this is secure. We learnt about the clues which show if a website is secure.



Websites might have a privacy policy.

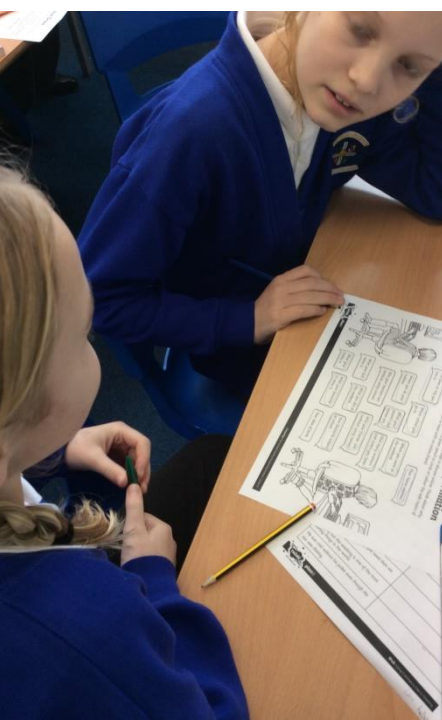




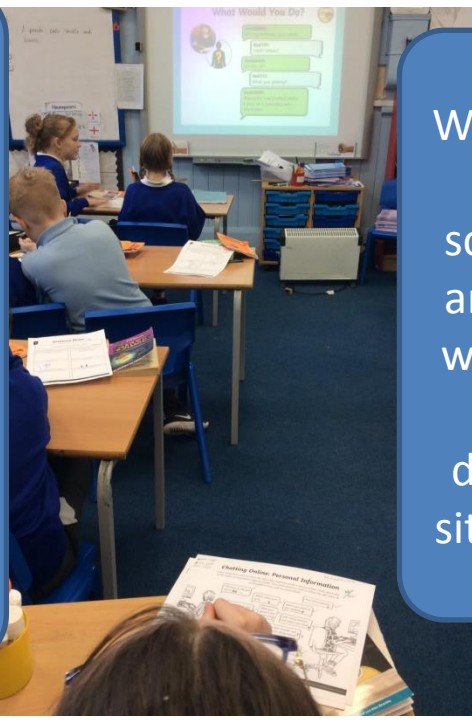
We thought about information that is safe to share with people you do not know online.



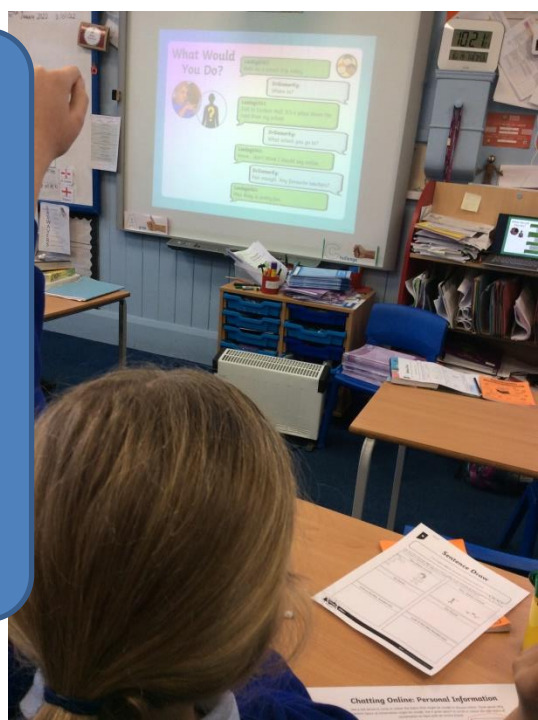
We looked at how easy it is to work out information from a few facts and how you do not know who is responding.

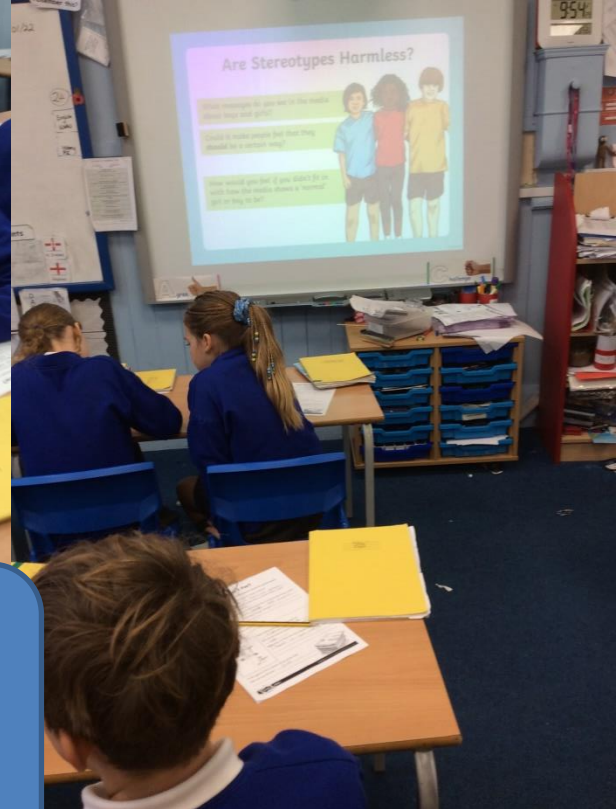


This lesson showed us that we need to be careful with what we say online as small bits of information can give a lot away.

In this lesson we learnt what gender stereotypes were and why they could be harmful. We looked at real adverts to see if we could spot gender stereotypes.

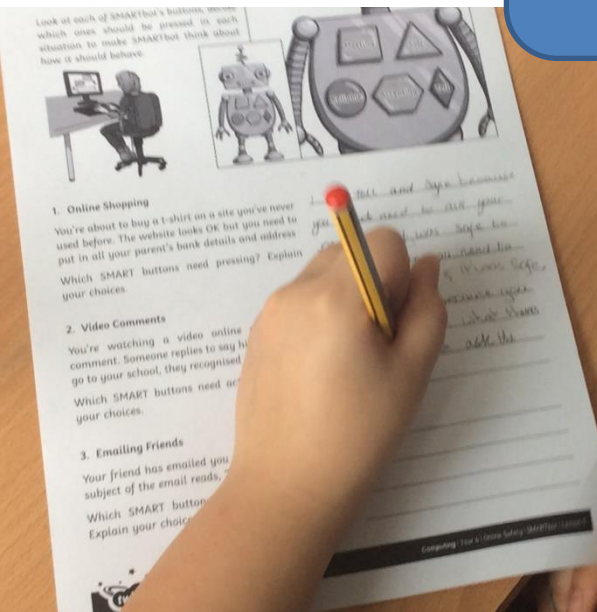


Toys can be for anyone. You should not be put off by adverts.

How can you tell a website is secure?



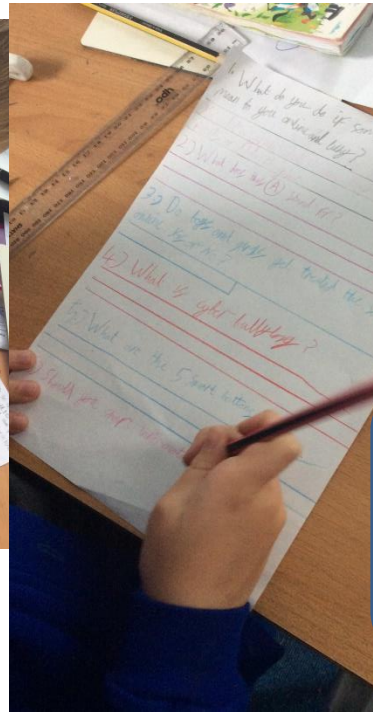
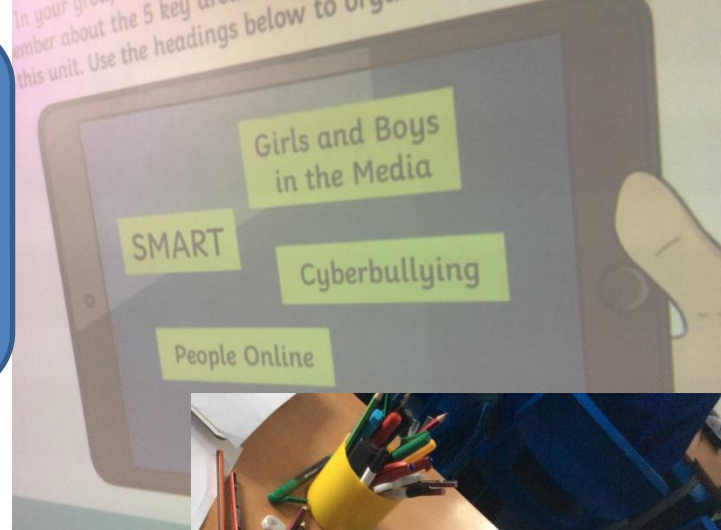
It is a good idea to ask people to only write one or two points to answer these questions, as it might be quite hard to try remember all of them!

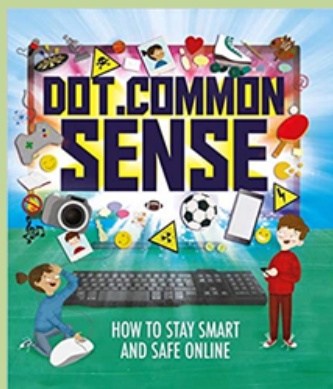

Subject Specific Vocabulary

cyberbullying	Bullying behaviour which takes places through the use of electronic means, such as through e-mail, mobile phones or posts on a social network
secure	protected from danger or harm
stereotype	A well-known idea or image of a group of people that is held by a number of people.
address bar	the text field in a web browser that identifies the user's location on the web
lock symbol	 Connection is secure
media	The main means of mass communication, such as television and radio broadcasts, publications (newspapers and magazines) and the internet.
private	belonging to or for the use of one particular person or group of people only
personal	belonging to or affecting a particular person rather than anyone else
