

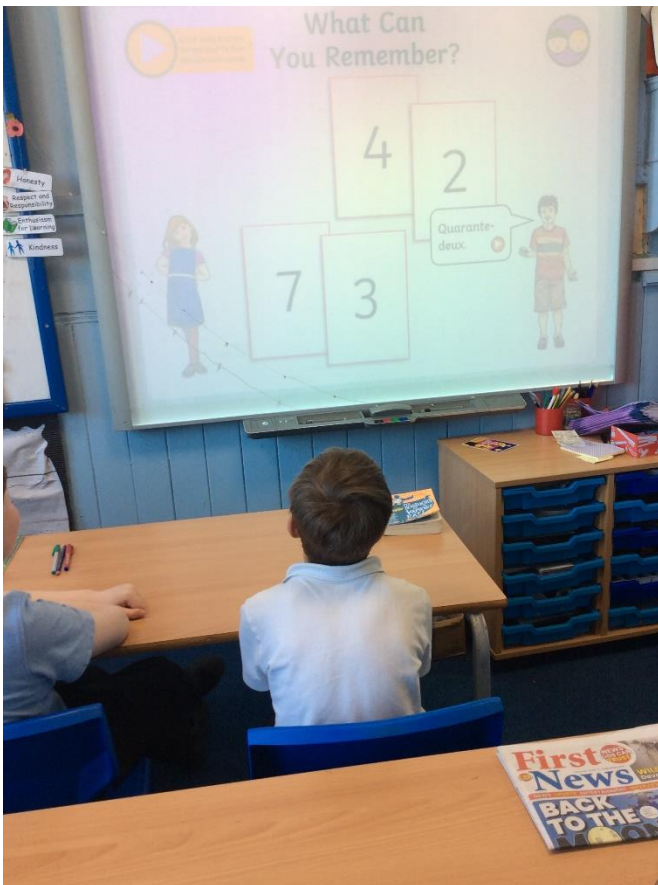
WHEN WERE YOU BORN?

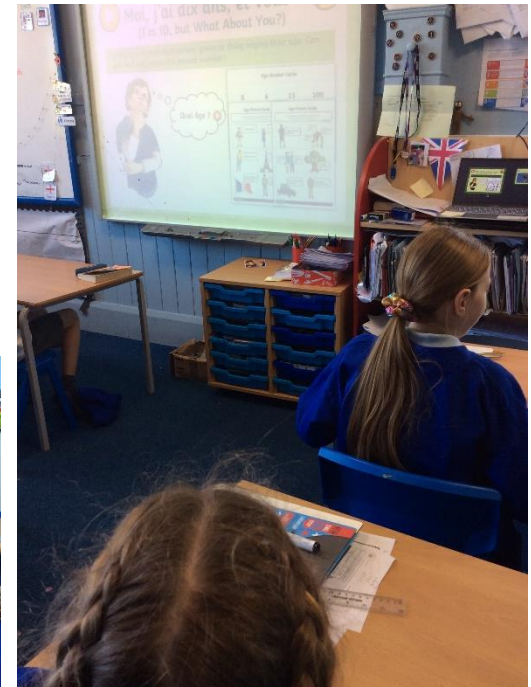
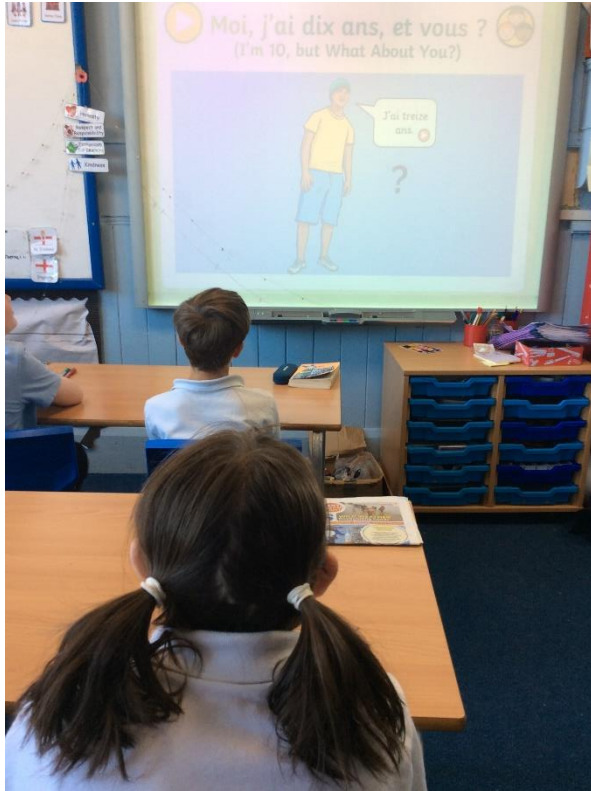

We used our work on dates last week to give the year of some key historical French events.

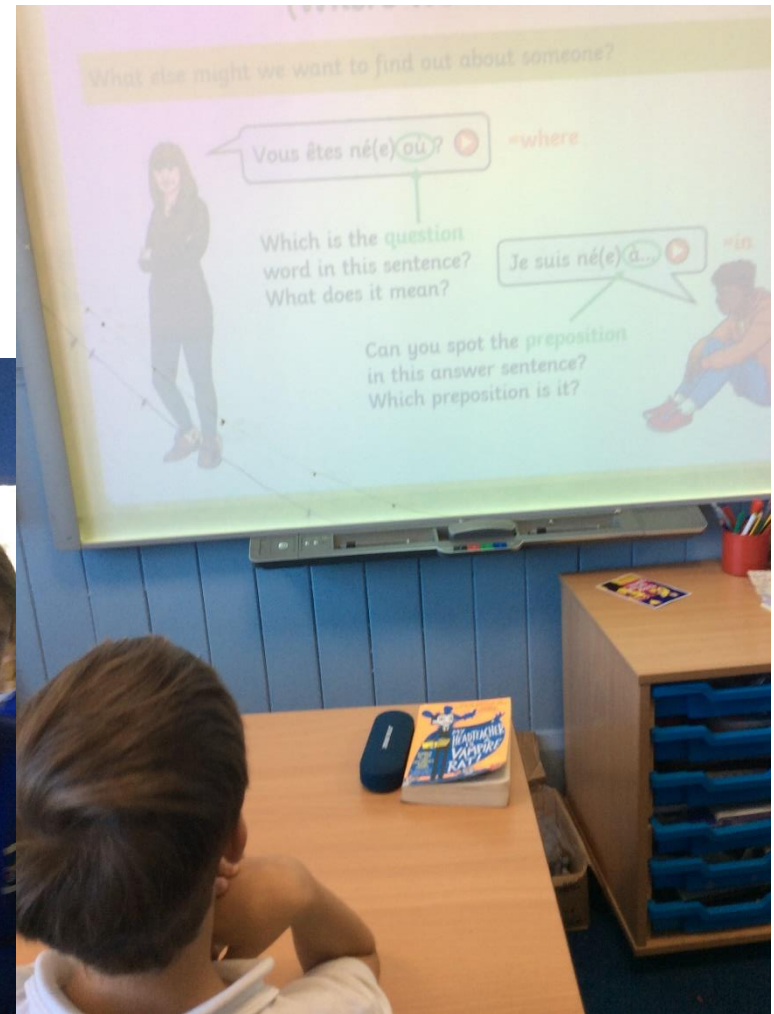
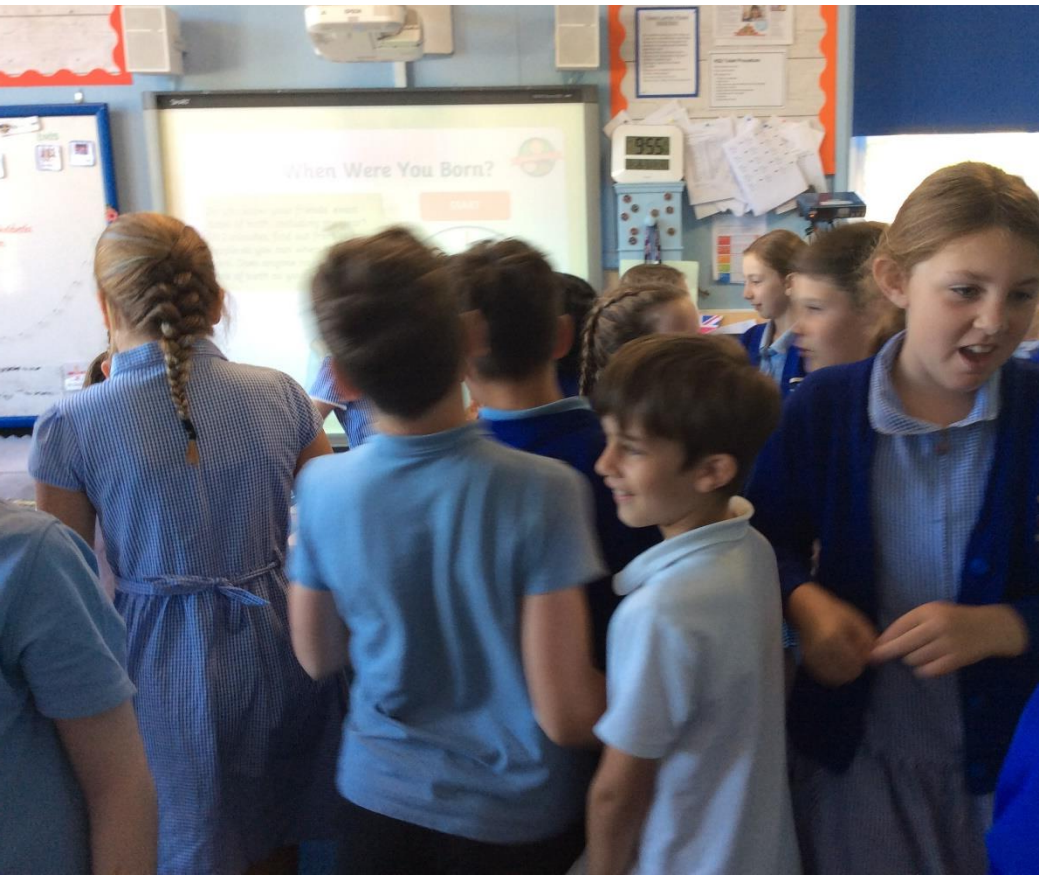


I was surprised by
