





What did the *Ancient Greeks* bring to the world?



We found out why we have the modern Olympics and that the people of Ancient Greece started them.




The Ancient Greeks started the Olympics but women were not allowed to compete.

In the Ancient Olympics they had to train in underwear but when they competed they had to be naked.




We found out about the importance of Gods and Goddesses to Ancient Greek life.


