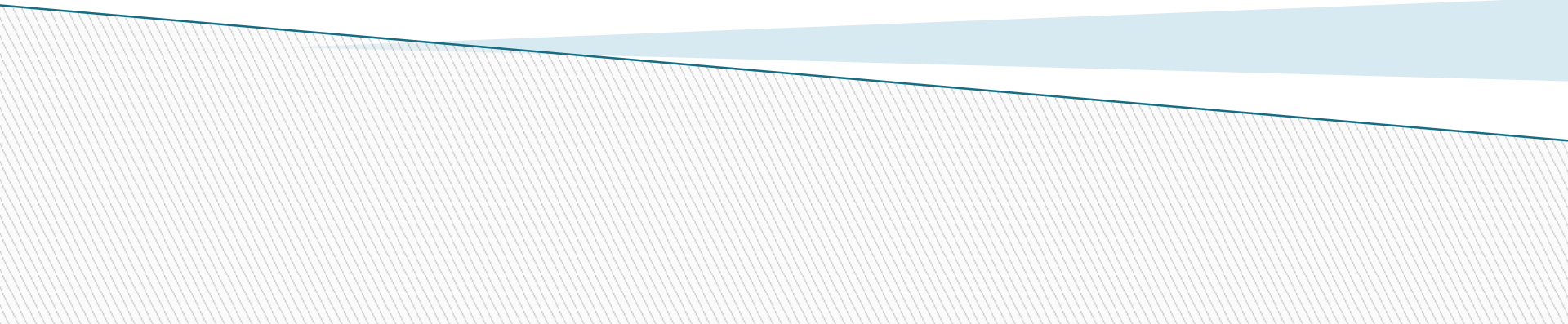

It was built to remember a king called George

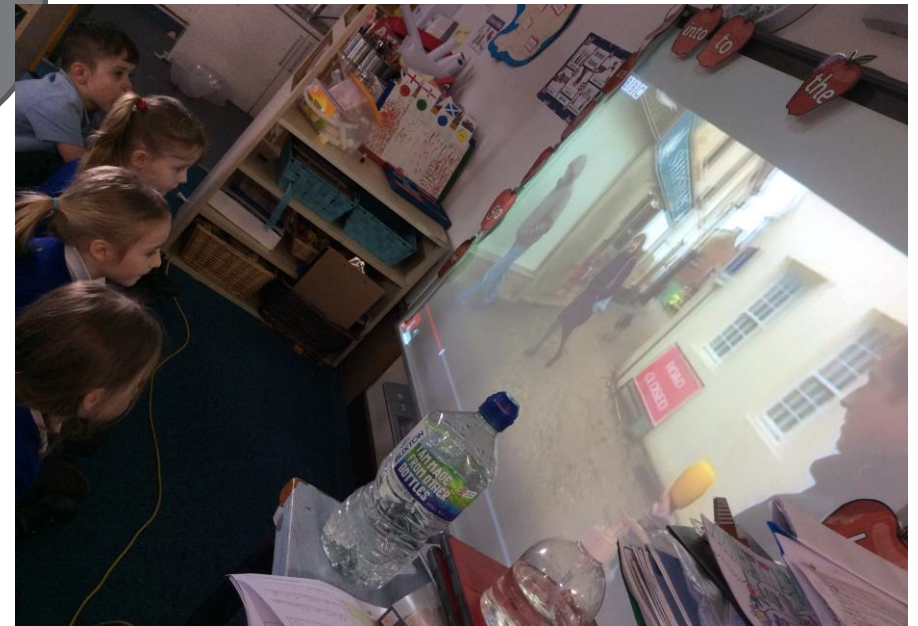
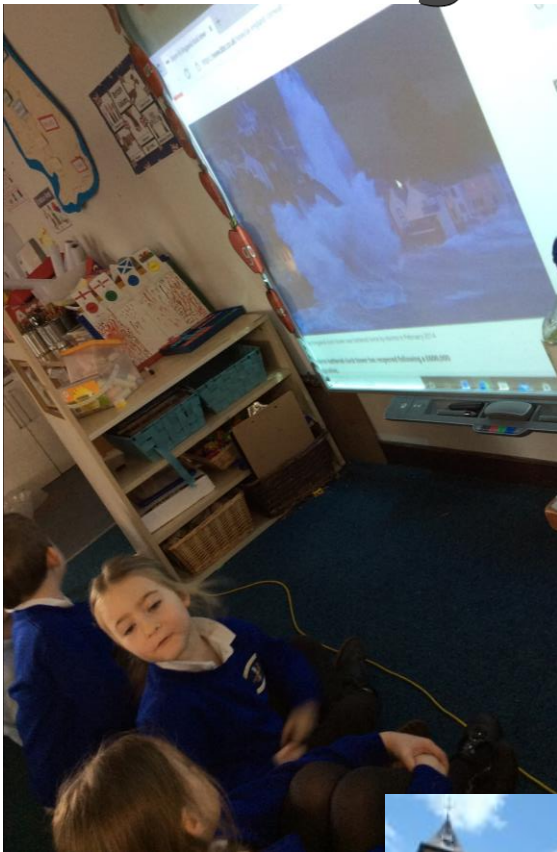
I have walked past it loads of times with my mum and dad.

We watched a selection of BBC News clips and read some articles about what happened. We found out that some builders fixed it up and made a new wall to keep it safe.

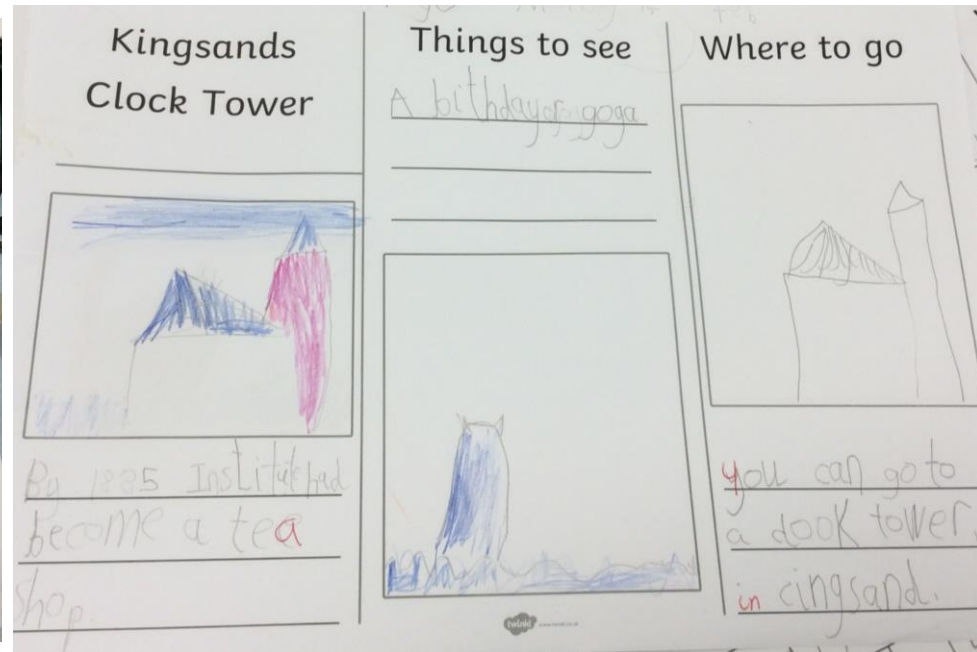
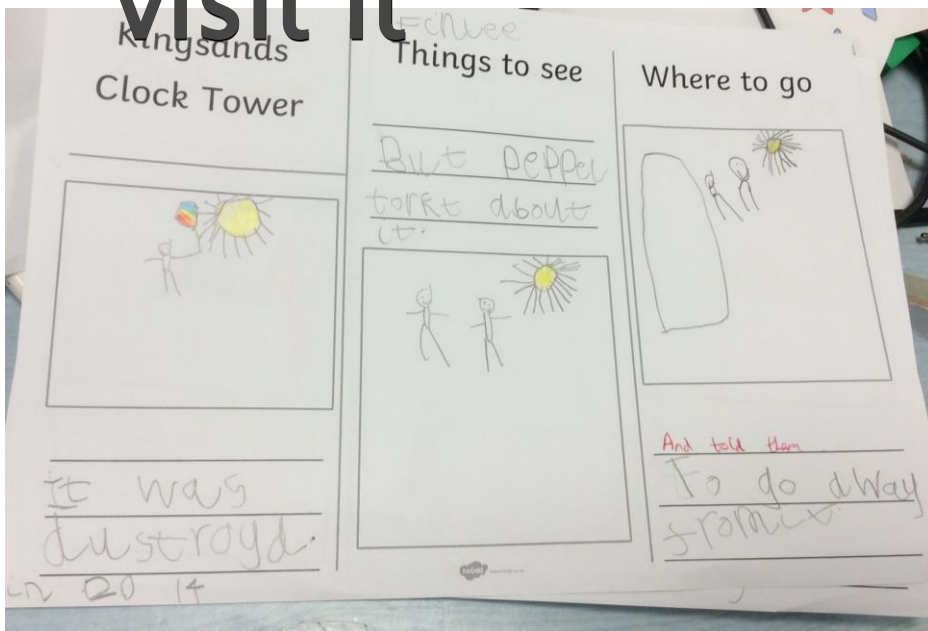

The clock tower was badly damaged twice by big waves in storms.

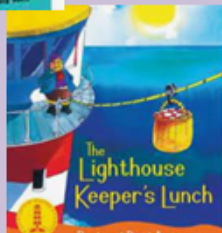
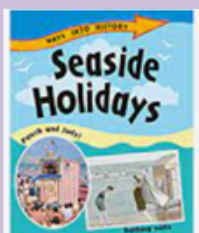
Because of the damage, there is now an extra sea wall to protect it from big waves in the future.
