
Science Autumn 2 2022 Class Cremyll The 4 seasons and weather.

For our next lesson, we looked at which months of the year make up each of the seasons. We then looked at images of each month of the year and we talked about what happens in each month. From this the children completed the Autumn and Winter sections of the Season wheel.



Next, we talked about the seasons of Autumn and Winter and recapped what we talked about last lesson around events which happen in each month. We looked closer at the pictures to see what the people were wearing. The children then designed outfits to wear in Autumn and Winter.



For our final lesson we completed the Autumn and Winter section of our seasons trees artwork. We talked about the colours we see on the trees as discussed in previous lessons, and the children selected their colours to complete their work.

There are 4 seasons- Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter.

The northern and southern parts of the world have different seasons at the same time.

Places around the middle of the Earth have 1 long dry season or 2 seasons, dry and rainy.

On Earth, seasons are the result of Earth's orbit around the Sun and Earth's axial tilt.

There are 12 months in a year. January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, December.

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Season	Division of the year based on changes in weather and number of daylight hours.
Weather	The state of the atmosphere at a particular place and time as regards heat, cloudiness, dryness, sunshine, wind, rain, etc.
Hibernate	Animals or plants stay in a dormant state.
Months	The year is split into 12 months
Thermometer	An instrument for measuring and indicating temperature.
Rain gauge	A device for collecting and measuring the amount of rain which falls.
Weather vane	A device, as a rod to which a freely rotating pointer is attached, for indicating the direction of the wind.
