

# Art and Sculpture design





To begin our unit we looked at photographs of sculptures created by Alexander Calder and David Oliveira.






It was interesting that it was easy to make 2D shapes but harder to make 3D shapes.

We examined how flexible it was. I was able to make my name.






We experimented with wire to see how easy it was to bend and what sort of shapes you could make.



We researched flower designs and thought about how we make it from wire, linking to what we had learnt about wire last week.




We had to think about how and if we could construct it from wire.



We combined our designs from last week and our skills from the lesson before to make the wire frame for our sculptures. We used plasticine as a base.

We discovered that it was easier to join the grey wire together with bits of the more bendy yellow wire.

The hardest bit was trying to get the shape you wanted so you had to try and see what you could get.





We made sure we stayed with the shape of the petals and followed the curve of the wire.



We used a combination of water and PVA glue to stick tissue paper to our frames.



We had to make sure that we tucked in the tissue paper underneath so it didn't hang down





The PVA wash made it quite heavy but when it dried it was stronger.

We left our finished designs to dry.


It was fun putting the tissue paper on and we didn't care if we got sticky.






Our finished sculptures!

If the wire was very bendy it was harder to wrap the tissue paper around it.




I found out that the gluiier the tissue paper the better it was to mould around the wire shape.


