





They have a little area with models of gods called a shrine.


They show their faith by lighting candles and being clean.




We thought about how Hindus show their faith when together, like at the Mandir.







Diwali is when celebrating the story of Rama and Sita and the lights on the way back from fighting the demon.

They celebrate with candles, lights, fireworks and special foods.


They put Rangoli patterns outside their doors to welcome the goddess of wealth.


