





How did Britain change between the beginning of the Stone Age and the end of the Iron Age







We looked at Skara Brae which helped archeologists find out about the Stone Age.




We also found out about Stone Henge.




We thought about the times around the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age.
