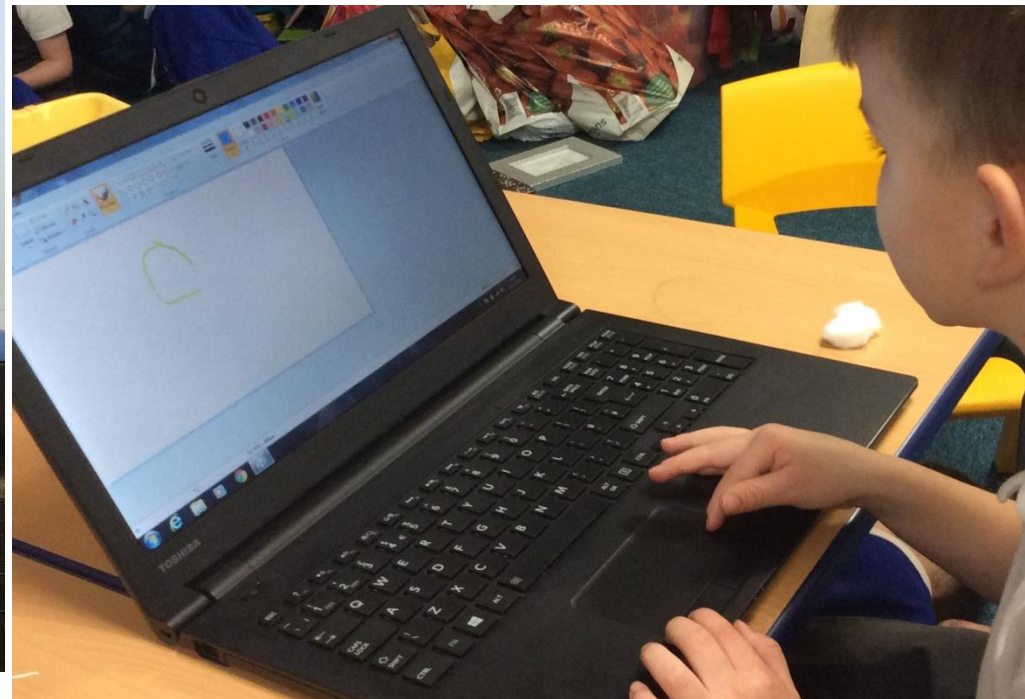
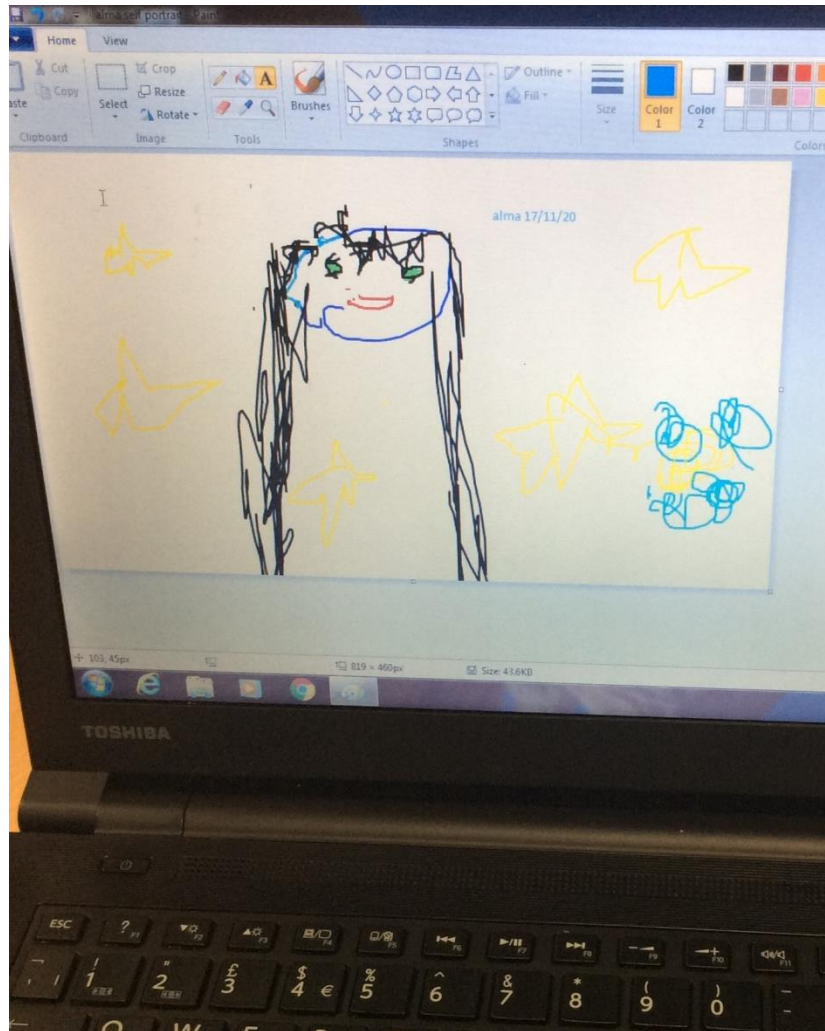

We learnt about Copyright and how we must name and date our work to prevent anyone else from stealing the rights and using our work as their own.

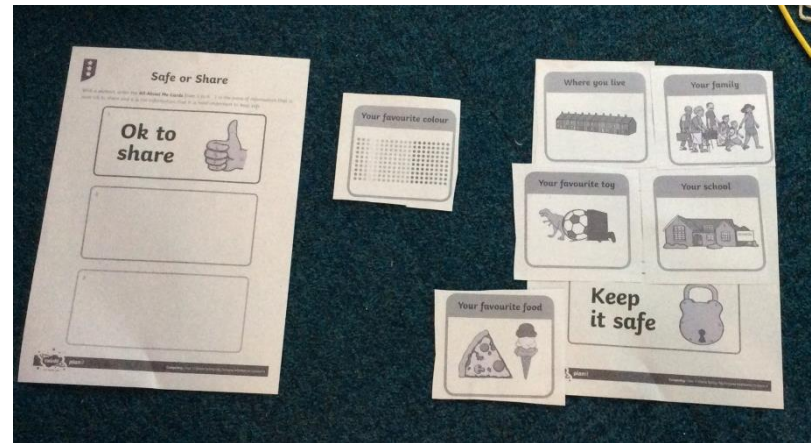
We created our own self portraits on the paint program and then added our name and the date before saving and printing our pictures.



Safe Searching and images

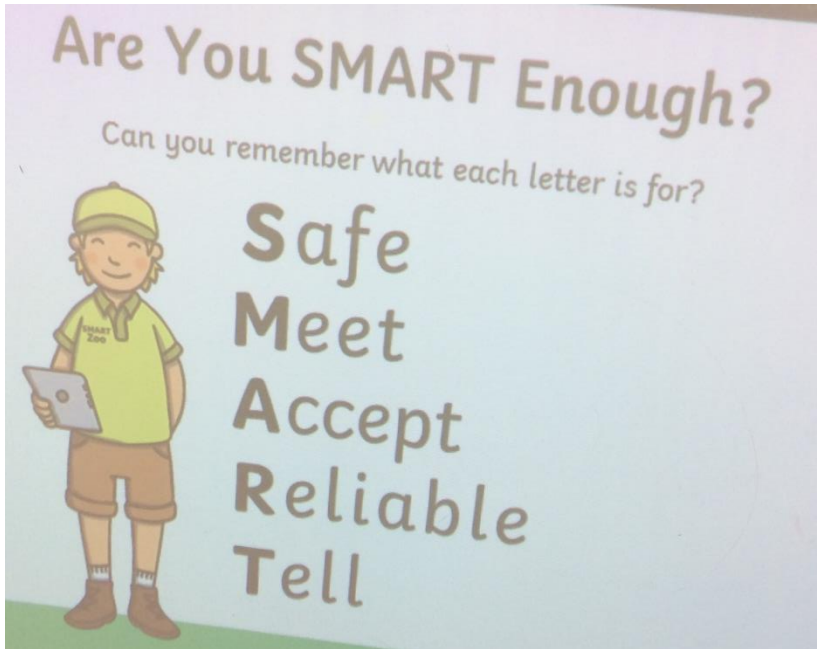
- Alma — we should use *safe search kids* to search for photos

Sharing personal information

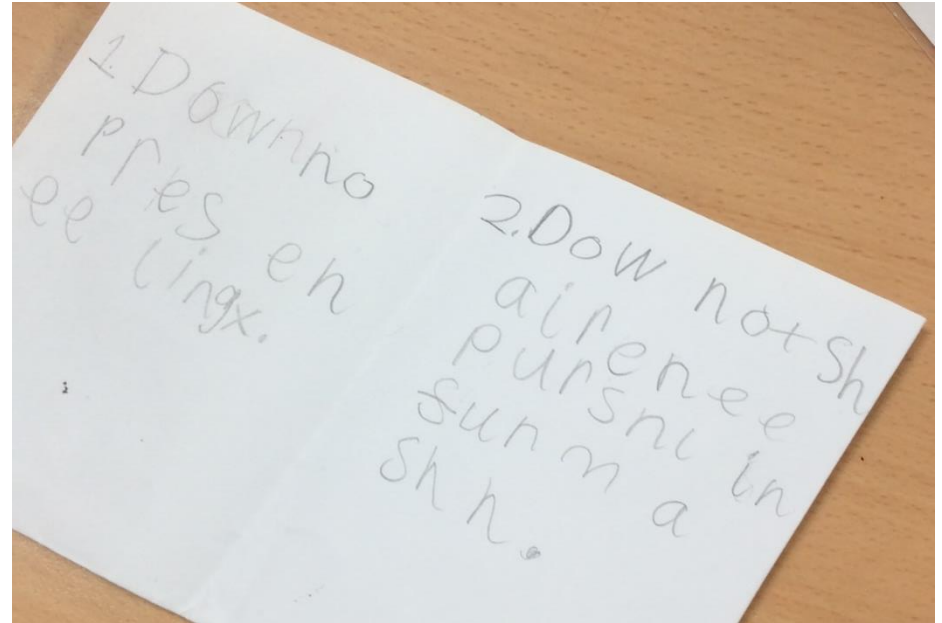

If you don't save your work, you will lose it. FF

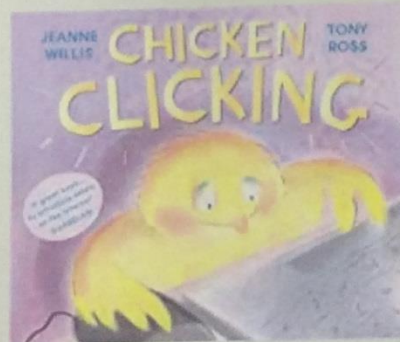
Always remember to put your name and date on your work so that everyone knows that it is yours and cannot copy it. FF
