

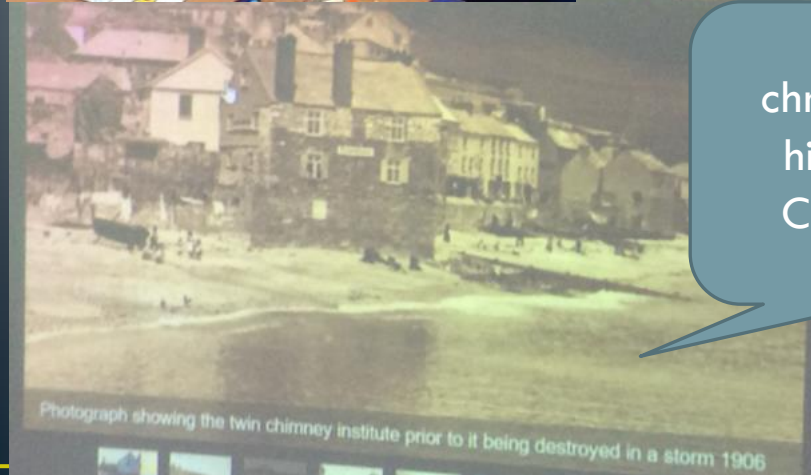

The Clocktower was originally a cottage in 1821.

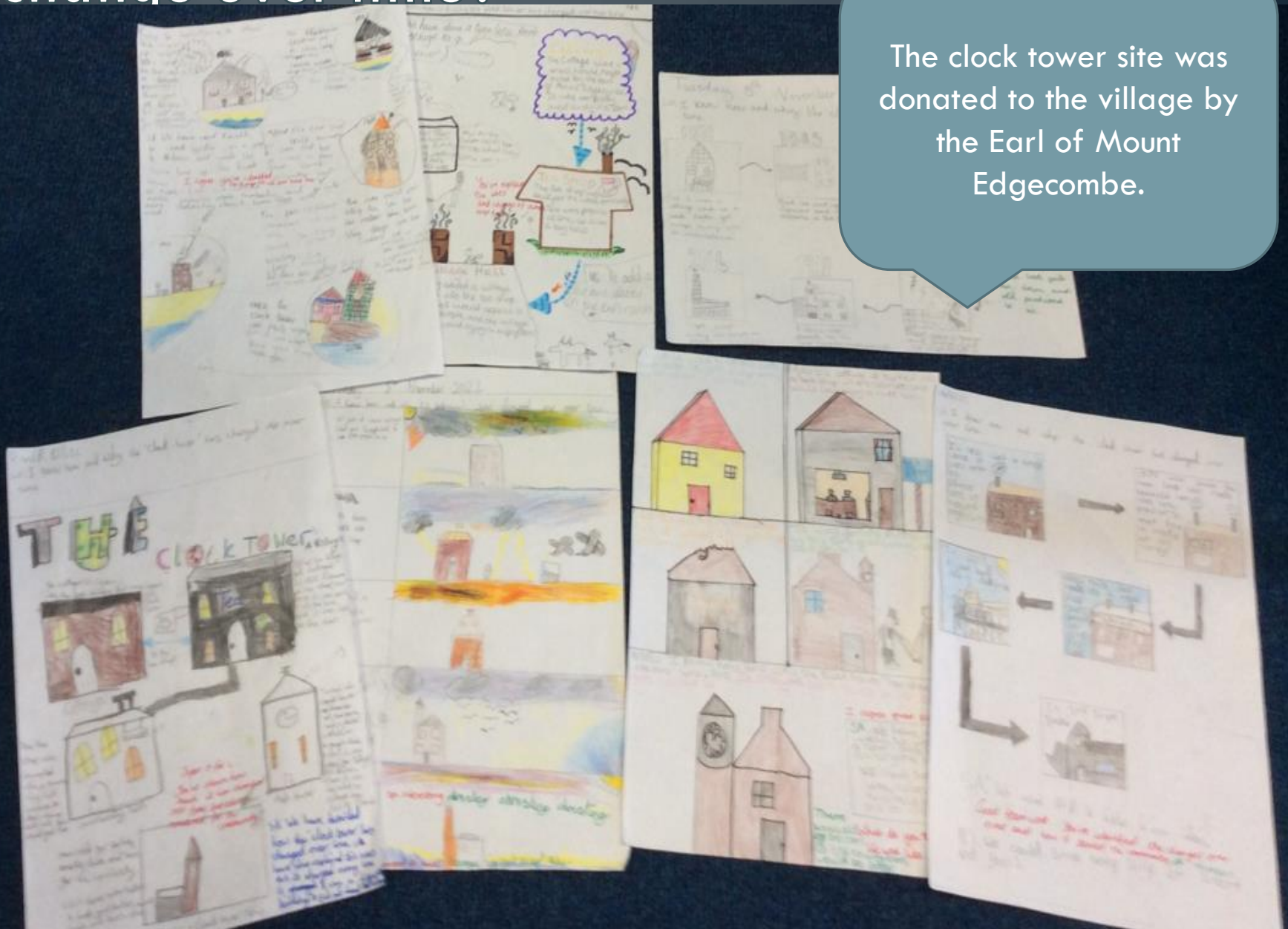


I know the chronology and history of the Clocktower in Kingsand.

The foundation stone was laid in 1911 when King George V had his coronation.

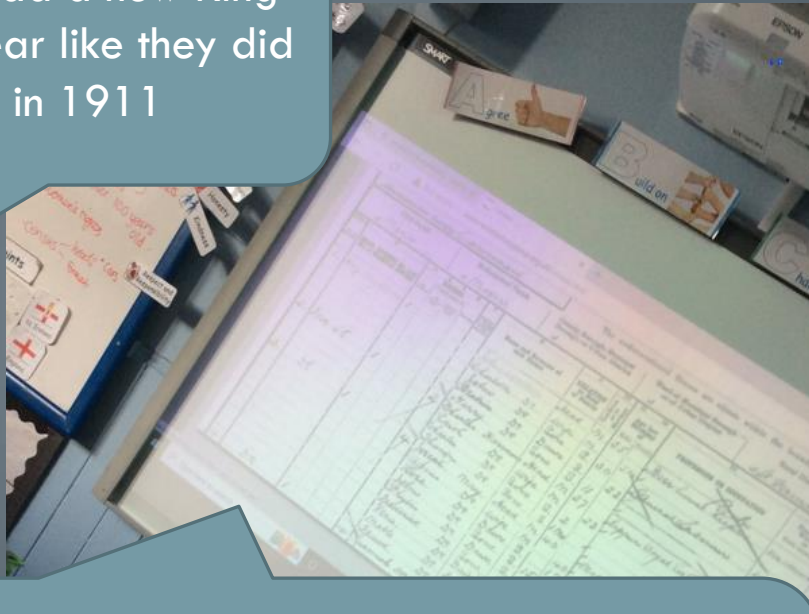
Who owned the clock tower and how did it change over time?

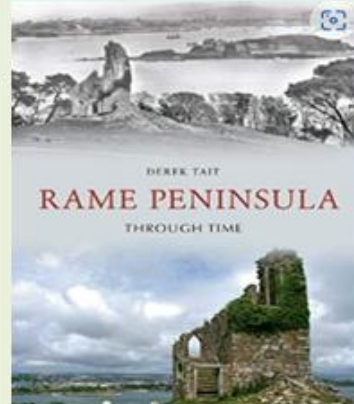
Forever Facts
