We used the 2011 census to see how many people belonged to a religion

Notes:

Buddhists do not believe there is a God.

Note also that not all religious believers agree about what 'God' is like; some say all religions are worshipping the same God, they just have different views of God; others say that there is one God but not all religions have the correct understanding.
