

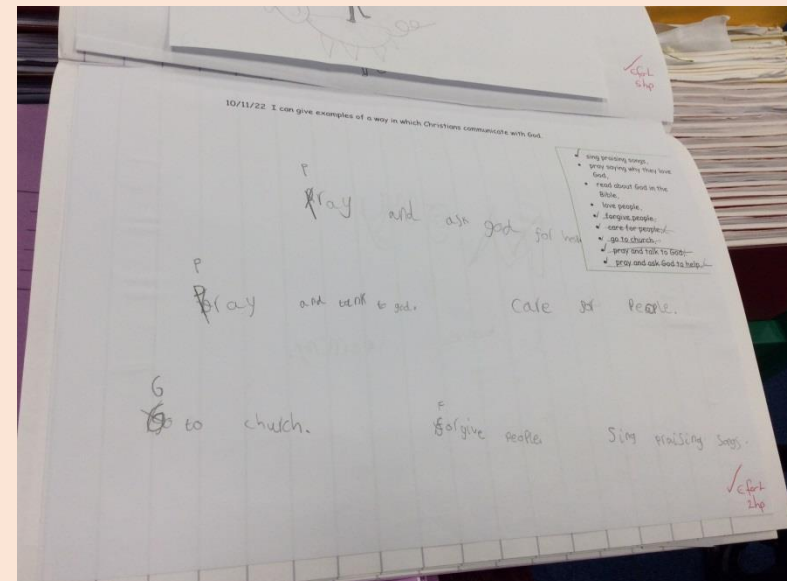
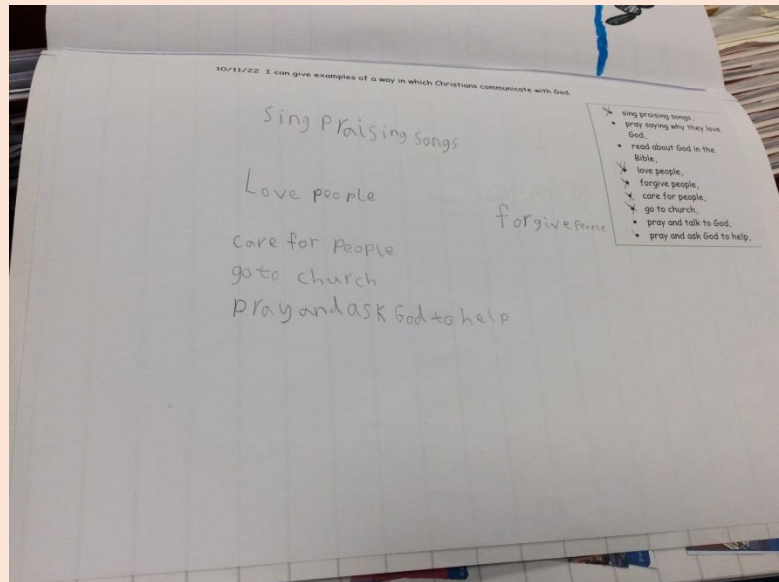

For our next two lessons we looked at the stories of The Lost Son and Jonah and the Big Fish and how God shows forgiveness. We then drew the surface story and the moral message.

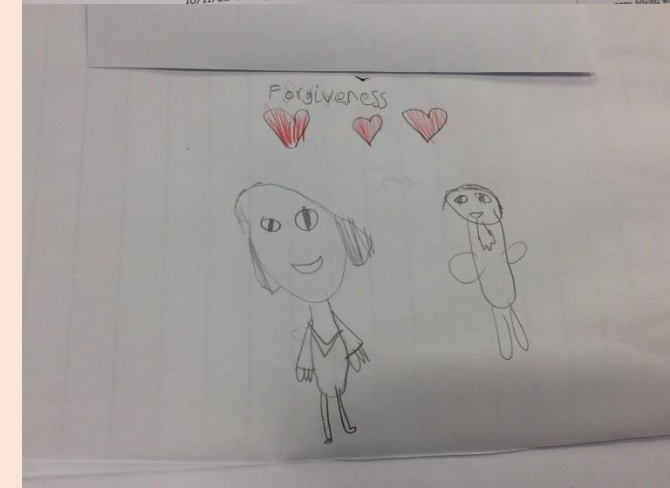
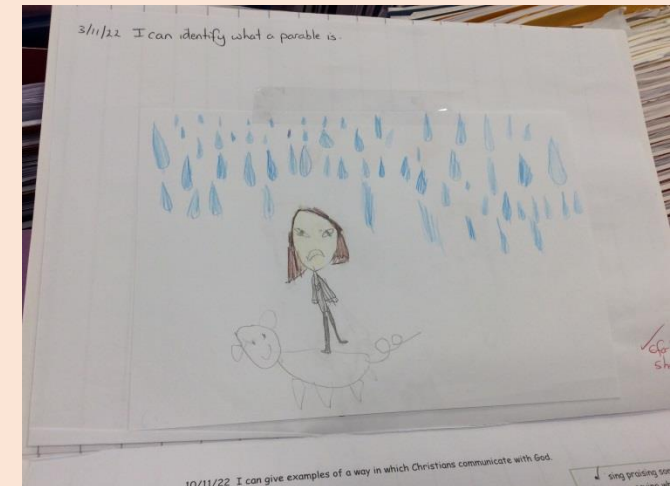


We can learn lessons from stories.

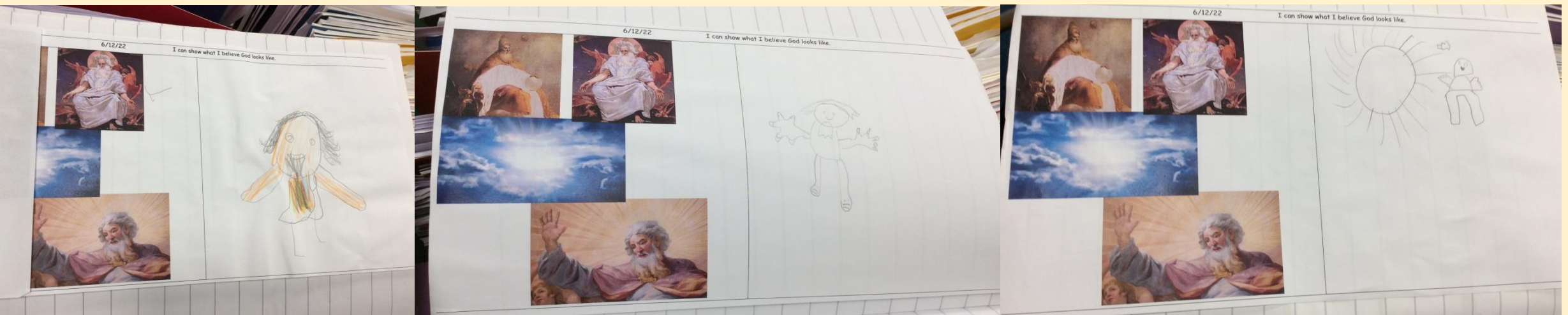
It's important to forgive people. Sometimes people do things they don't mean to and we should still be nice to them.
