

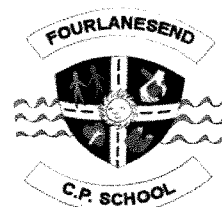
Fourlanesend Community Primary School

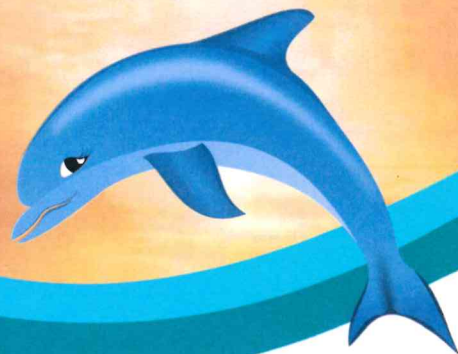

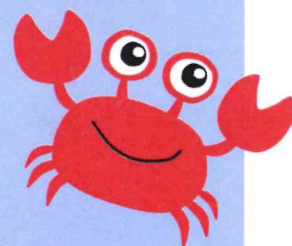

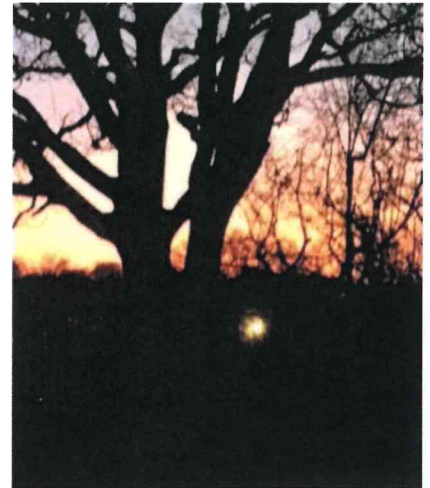
