Staggered Starts and Finishes

We have had a request from the Parish Council to reintroduce the 10 minute time slots as they feel there are lots of cars pulling in and out at the same time. However, from what we have seen on the gates everyday and feedback from parents and carers the issues are much improved. Our ongoing concern is, and always has been, other cars not collecting from the school speeding past the school during busy periods. We have informed the parish council we will not reintroduce the 10 minute stagers for several reasons:

- Firstly on reviewing the risk assessments, in light of new government guidance, we cannot have the staff stood together for more than 15 minutes as it increases the risk of transmission.
- The 10 minute gaps were impacting on the learning time for the children in school, this is already narrowed by hand washing and hygiene routines in place. Let's face it, you want the teachers teaching your children and not spending an hour a day on the gate.
- The 10 minute gaps were put in to help parents and carers to not arrive at school together. This has been achieved mostly, that is why we have reduced it to 5 minutes.
- Please continue to support us by following the guidance above and as always your feedback is greatly appreciated.
