Here are the details on how your child can attain their Book Quest certificates:

In KS1, they need to read one book from each of the following categories to earn a bronze, then another in each for silver and one more in each for a gold:

- Fiction
- N/fiction
- Traditional
- Magazine
- Poem

In KS2, they need to read 2 from each category for a bronze, then another 2 in each for a silver and 2 more in each for a gold:

- Information/autobiography/biography
- Poetry
- Adventure/animals/mystery/crime/horror/action
- Graphic novels
- Fantasy/fairy tale/sci-fi/myths and legends/humour

In both key stages, they are not limited to gold. We had to research gemstones last year to keep up with the amount of books read!
