Online Safety Bill Announced

New Online Harms Laws #SafeOnline

Outlining what are described as 'landmark laws' to protect children and young people online, the government has released its

draft <u>Online Safety Bill</u>, establishing a new regulatory framework to tackle harmful content online.

The draft Bill includes changes to put an end to harmful practices, while ushering in a new era of accountability and protections for democratic debate, including:

- Further provisions to tackle prolific online scams
- Social media sites, website, apps and other services hosting user-generated content or allowing people to talk to others must remove and limit the spread of illegal and harmful content
- Ofcom will be given the power to fine companies failing in a *new duty of care* up to £18 million

Whisper is a social 'confessional' app that allows users to post whatever's on their mind, which is then paired with an image.



The app encourages private communications in which users can exchange images and personal information. The location sharing feature in this app helps users connect with other users nearby.

The iOS app requires users to confirm they're at least 17 years old before they download the app.
