- 53% 3-4s go online for nearly 8hrs per week
- 66% 4-7s plays games for more than 7hrs per week
- 23% 8-11s have a social media profile
- 83% 12-15s have their own smartphone
- 90% 12-15s use YouTube
- Boys in each age group 5-15 spend more time playing games compared to girls
