**Class Lynher** - We played a tennis tournament in PE and in science we produced presentations about Sir David Attenborough and Jane Goodall. In English, we read the poem Jabberwocky by Lewis Carroll and then wrote our own poems in a similar style. In French, we have learnt the names of vegetables and how to ask for them in a shop. **Class Tamar** - This week we have really focused on science and learning all about fossils. We watched a video all about Mary Anning and how she was instrumental in the original discovery and interest in fossils over 200 hundred years ago. We then had a go at making our own fossils by taking imprints of shells in play dough and then wrote exciting back stories all about their imaginary origin and how they became frozen in time. In computing, we have been using the programming software Scratch to get sprites to move based on algorithms we created.
