

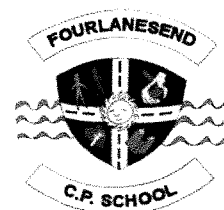

If you think you may be entitled to free school meals, please apply at www.cornwall.gov.uk/schoolmeals. Don't forget that ALL children in KS1 (Plym & Cremyll), are entitled to free lunches. For KS2 children who pay for dinners, they cost £2.34 per day. If they have a dinner all week, it is £9.36 as you get 5 meals for the price of 4. All school lunches are made fresh every day, with a variety of options available. If your child has special dietary requirements, this will be catered for.
