

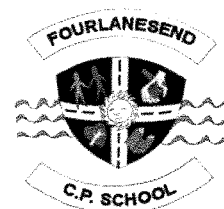

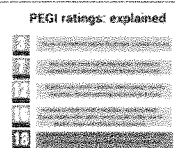


PEGI Ratings
